Memorial of an Indenture made at Aquafort in the Southern District of the Island of Newfoundland on the Twenty first day of December One Thousand Eight hundred and Thirty five, between John Maloley of Aquafort aforesaid on the one part, and Anna Winsor of said place on the other part— Witnesseth that the said John Maloley, for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven Pounds ten shillings Currency to him in hand paid by the said Anna Winsor, did by the said Indenture Grant, bargain and sell, assign and transfer unto the said Anna Winsor her Heirs and assigns— "All that Dwelling House Gardens and Lands situate in Aquafort aforesaid, and called or known by the name of the Glens bounded on the West by Property occupied by Robert Bowden, on the East by property occupied by Thomas Stamp, and on the North by a Pond called David Melcher's Pond" and ~~being~~ occupied by the said John Maloley.
