hundred and eighty one Between the said Widow of St.  
John's aforesaid Widow of the one part and Thomas  
G. Morry of Ferryland merchant of the other part  
Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the  
sum of One Dollar in hand well and truly paid to  
her the said the said Widow by the said Thomas G.  
Morry the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged She  
the said the said Widow hath granted bargained sold  
assigned transferred and set over and by deed  
present doth grant bargain sell assign transfer  
and set over unto the said Thomas G. Morry his  
Executors Administrators and assigns All her right  
title and interest in to and out of all those  
messuages lands tenements hereditaments and  
premises at present in possession of John Morry  
situate lying and being in Ferryland aforesaid  
and comprised within the following limits or  
boundaries that is to say bounded on the North West  
by the high road leading to Caplin Bay on the South  
West by a certain rock in the harbor of Ferryland  
aforesaid called "Anchor Rock" on the South by the said  
harbor on the South East by property of Robert

soldsworth and on the north north west by the sea shore of Esplanade  
aforesaid together with all messuages out houses stables flatter outhouses  
erections yards gardens meadows and appurtenances to be hereover  
to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining or reputed as part  
or parcel thereof and all the estate right title interest property  
claim and demand whatsoever either at law or in equity of  
them the said John Thorry and Peter Saint Le Messurier  
with all reversions and rights of reversion and remainder or  
remainders and all pleas deeds evidences and documents which in  
anywise relate to the said premises or any part thereof to have and  
to hold the same unto the said Thomas G. Thorry his Executors  
Administrators and Assigns for ever subject nevertheless to  
the trusts interests and purposes hereinafter set forth that is  
to say to hold Trust that he the said Thomas G. Thorry shall hold  
the said messuage lands and premises aforesaid for the use behalf  
and benefit of Florence B. Thorry Alice W. Thorry Victoria Frances  
Thorry and Jane Josephine Thorry whilst they remain single  
and unmarried and upon the marriage of the said Florence B.  
Thorry - Alice W. Thorry - Victoria Frances Thorry and Jane Josephine  
Thorry or their death then the said lands messuages tenements  
and all and singular the premises to be the property of the said  
Thomas G. Thorry his heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns in
